CORPORATE CONNECT

Services provided by Y4J were actively being implemented pan India. Different facilitators who have expertise in different areas came together to conduct various workshops with different clients.

People with disabilities are often discriminated against in the hiring process. This may be due to assumptions about their abilities, or concerns about the cost of accommodations etc..

Even if an employer is willing to hire a person with a disability, they may not be equipped to provide the necessary accommodations to enable the person to perform their job duties effectively. This could include things like specialized equipment, modifications to the physical workspace, or adjustments to work schedules or duties.

Invisible disabilities are physical, mental, or neurological conditions that are not immediately visible to others.

Some examples of invisible disabilities include chronic pain, fibromyalgia, chronic fatigue syndrome, anxiety disorders, depression, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), autism spectrum disorder, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), learning disabilities, and epilepsy. Other invisible disabilities may include gastrointestinal disorders, autoimmune diseases, sensory processing disorders, and chronic migraines, among others.




